

The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw. O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? Why do you make me look upon injustice Why do you permit tyranny? Destruction and violence are all around me: strife and contention arise. So the law becomes slack, and justice never prevails. For a work is being done in your days that you would not believe if you were told. 
