Worship this summer at St. John has been a joy, with different people of all services together, sharing a common liturgy and praising God through the variety of music our talented musicians offer us from the gifts God has given. During coffee hour and hanging out after worship on Sundays, we shared our names, our time, our lives, connecting with each other and caring for one another, deepening our faith life together.

Summer is always refreshing, but there is something settling about a return to the fall! Our Back-to-school Blessing and Confirmation Day signal the change this month, as we surround our children with prayer and blessing and return to our regular Sunday worship times. September brings Hunger Action Month, Quilt Sunday, and ministries for people of all ages.

Autumn brings back all these good and favored things, but, if you still wistfully long for the single worship service of summer...we've got a new opportunity this year to bring people together again across boundaries of worship time and age.

Between Sunday services in September and October, we are offering Sunday school for people of all ages!

This is an experiential, interactive, churchwide bible study that makes room for the wonder of the child and the wisdom of the elder. Called The Generosity Project, it is designed to turn us to scripture and toward one another to remember our values, strengthen our discipleship, and deepen our faith. Single people and families. older people, younger people, and everyone in between will engage with the principles of our faith, sharing the challenges of living them out, and strengthening the joyful practice of generosity.

We often begin the fall in the book of Genesis. Formational stories of our faith are found here, giving us glimpses from the beginning of time, nurturing an imagination of God and God's people, playing with ideas of where we came from, who we are, and why we exist.

The Generosity Project begins in Genesis, chapter one, when God created the world as a gift, making human beings in God's image and calling us to be stewards of it all - to be caring and connected, generous and grateful. The creation stories foster the belief that with God all things are possible, God will provide, and we have more than enough.

Through large group and small group story-telling, crafts, videos, songs, and simple questions, a generosity of spirit will be encouraged that we may share ourselves with the world God created as faithful stewards nurturing a living, daring confidence in God's grace.

Sunday School

with their peers at church, fun activities, arts and crafts, and
learning based around a topic. Again and again, we see that
kids who come to Tween GO end up having deeper church
friendships when they start Confirmation, and a clearer
sense of what faith looks like in their life. Plus, it's just fun!

Youth Choir

St. John is blessed with thriving music ministries, and our youth choir is no exception. From musical development, to community building, groups like these help youth to form lifelong church friendships and silly memories that they will remember for years to come. This group of students 8th grade and under routinely performs in worship, as they learn music concepts that will serve them in future endeavors. Confirmation (7th-9th Grade)

Confirmation is the centerpiece of our youth program at St. John, and the rite of passage into adulthood in the church. Most Wednesday nights during the school year, from 7:00 - 8:15pm, our 7th, 8th, and 9th grade students meet to learn from our pastors about faith in a way that connects to their lives and answers the real questions they have. Each year is packed with large group learning events based on the theme of our curriculum, small group check-ins, activities to practice faith, service projects, and time set apart to play games and connect with each other. Registration is open for this fall semester and the form can be found on our website!

This Fall: Things will ramp up quickly with our Orientation Meeting on Sept. 13th and classes beginning the following Wed., Sept. 20th. This year our youth will be experiencing "The Year of Belief", which will cover The Apostle's Creed, Lutheranism, and Other World Religions! It will be a whirlwind with plenty of fascinating discussions, creative activities, field trips, and time for reflection about what we believe here at St. John by the Mall.

A look back on the Nashville Mission Trip with Pastor Evan Mayhew

From July 8th through the 15th, 11 kids and 5 adults from St. John piled into two 15 passenger vans and traveled down to Nashville, TN for a mission trip that none of us will soon forget! While we were there, we partnered with Serve Boldly, an ELCA based mission trip organization, who organized service opportunities, evening outings, and led our devotions and worships. The three adults who led us shared their passion and their inspirational stories, and we were so grateful to welcome them into our family for the week! We were also joined by 4 additional youth and a youth leader, Doug Dusthimer, from St. James Lutheran Church in Lake Forest, IL (one of our Campfirmation partners and the former parish of Pastor Richard Holmer).

While in Nashville, we had so many eye-opening experiences that it is hard to summarize all that happened. But one thing was certain: whether it was working the food line at Nashville Rescue Mission (a night shelter), working with kids at Mt. Carmel Community Church (a parish that had recently lost it's pastor), serving meals at Room in the Inn (a day shelter with a focus on dignity), organizing shoes at Soles 4 Souls (a non-profit repurposing old shoes to be sent all over the world), sorting medical supplies at Project C.U.R.E. (a non-profit that sends unused medical equipment to hospitals all over the world), assisting the local food bank, working at a community farm that employs adults with disabilities, doing yard work at community member houses, or just taking care of anything else that needed to be done, our kids rose to the occasion and then some. In fact, many of the organizations we worked with commented in awed gratitude on just how hard our youth worked, and how dedicated they were to the tasks at hand. Many said they were amazed at what we were able to get done in the limited time we had. There's a lot to be proud of, and that list of organizations barely scratches the surface of everything we did while we were there!

Along the way, our youth also delighted in what we called "Random Acts of Kindness", giving out tie blankets to anyone who they made connections with or who showed kindness to us on the road. This included non-profit managers, 7-Eleven employees, cashiers, and many more! The joy and surprise on their faces was a wonderful part of our trip. In the evenings, the youth were able to experience the local culture by spending time at Centennial Park, visiting the National Museum of African-American Music, going to a line dancing restaurant, and exploring Broadway (the main drag in Nashville). On our way down and back we were also able to do a little bit of sight-seeing. We experienced Fowling (a mixture of bowling and football) while in Indianapolis, visited the Lost River Cave in Kentucky, took a picture with Superman in Metropolis, IL, went swimming, and admired the Cross at the Crossroads in Effingham, IL.

The big theme of the trip was Gentrification and how it has affected the city and buildings of Nashville, but more importantly, the people who lived there. The question that was asked again and again was, "It's great when the city gets nicer, but what happens to the people who used to live there, and can no longer afford to do so?" One of our most impactful moments came while serving at Room in the Inn, a day shelter for those experiencing homelessness with a heavy focus on personal dignity, something that other shelters often are unable to do given the sheer numbers they are serving. Near the end of a tour, our guide showed us a mural of a tree, with each leaf containing a name. He reflected on how people who are homeless are many times given no dignity in life, and how often that also translates to no dignity in death. They are buried or cremated unceremoniously, often with no one present to mourn them. This



tree was their way of making sure those people, often members of their community at the shelter, are not forgotten, with each leaf representing one person who had died. It was a stunning reminder of why it is so important that everyone knows that they are loved. Jesus remembers each of them, and we are called to do so as well.

Overall, it was a powerful trip that caused all of us to re-examine the comfortable world we live in. How might we live differently and treat the people we come across with dignity knowing better how they live and what they have to do just to survive? How does it change our daily attitude to know that we might not personally solve the world's problems, but we are called to be a link in the long chain stretching from the past and into the future of people working toward a solution? What might our community at St. John be called to do for our neighbors that we are not already doing? What might change in our personal lives as a result of this trip? On our final night, we processed everything we experienced and reflected on what wisdom we might bring home to our community, and you would be inspired to know all the connections our kids made. Their voices may very well be at the forefront of the next chapter of St. John.

Thank you for your support of the youth that makes life-changing trips like these possible! You may never see the impact you have made, but I hope you know that every participant on this trip left it a more well-rounded person. They will carry this experience with them for the rest of their lives.

September is Hunger Action Month! Check out the new and exciting things we are doing to serve our neighbors! During the pandemic, the challenges we faced forced innovation in many areas. I had never taken advantage of online ordering for groceries as I loved to browse the aisles to meal plan, but now I could never go back from the convenience of placing my order when I am relaxing at home and swinging by the grocery store on my way home the next day to collect my groceries curbside. In the food pantry, we also worked hard to adapt to meet the growing needs of our neighbors in a way that allowed our volunteers to stay safe while serving the community. The work we did helped us strengthen our relationship with the community and our partnership with Northern Illinois Food Bank. This summer we were approached by the food bank to invite our agency to apply to be a part of a pilot program that would allow families to place their food pantry order online and pick it up curbside at St John!

This September, in celebration of Hunger Action Month, we will be one of the first agencies in the network to launch this online ordering program! We are so proud of the work our volunteers are doing to prepare for this new distribution and excited to be able to serve 50 additional families each week! We would love to have you sign up at stiphnfood.org to "Take Action" and join us for a shift to help us with this exciting new initiative!



Serve: We can't continue this work without our volunteers and would love for you to join us on a shift! Each week we are serving over 450 families. At this current rate of need we will need to start limiting the number of families we serve unless we have more people join our volunteer team! Who can Volunteer? Food pantry volunteers come from all walks of life, have different abilities, and offer valuable experience that has helped us grow and serve efficiently. I'm so incredibly proud of what we have created and look forward to welcoming new and returning volunteers.



Donate: Did you know that St. John does not purchase any food pantry groceries? It's true. The Food Pantry budget is funded 100% by designated gift donations. Each week we spend \$900 on food and \$100 on personal care/baby products. Every donated dollar delivers an amazing abundance of food and personal care items without impacting St. John's operating budget.

Rachel & Bradley Ufflemann (Son Conner)



Message from the Council President

Greetings dear friends in faith,
