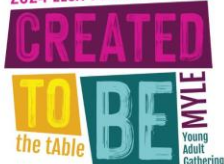



- *After receiving communion, place the used communion cup in the basket, and return to your pew via the side aisle.*

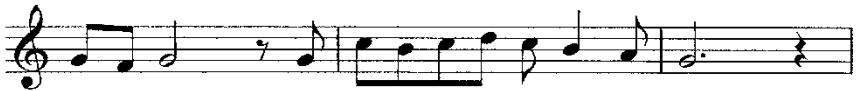


