What I'm getting at, friends, is that you should simply keep on doing what you've done from the beginning. When I was living among you, you lived in responsive obedience. Now that I'm separated from you, keep it up. Better yet, redouble your efforts. Be energetic in your life of salvation, reverent and sensitive before God. That energy is *God*'s energy, an energy deep within you, God himself willing and working at what will give him the most pleasure.

Do everything readily and cheerfully—no bickering, no second-guessing allowed! Go out into the world uncorrupted, a breath of fresh air in this squalid and polluted society. Provide people with a glimpse of good living and of the living God. Carry the light-giving Message into the night so I'll have good cause to be proud of you on the

day that Christ returns. You'll be living proof that I didn't go to all this work for nothing. 

There are two ways to receive communion today:

## Receiving Communion in your pew

You may receive communion in your pew with the elements contained in the communion pod. The pastor will say the words of distribution after the Invitation to Communion:

The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you.

## Receiving Communion at the altar

- You will be invited forward by the pastor.
- You may bring your offering/attendance slip forward and place in the offering basket or place in the offering plates by the doors as you leave.
- Wear your masks as you come forward; lift your mask when receiving the elements of bread and then again with the grape juice or the wine.
- The deep purple wine is on the outer rings of the tray; the golden grape juice is on the inner rings of the tray.
- After receiving communion, place the used communion cup in the basket, and return to your pew via the side aisle.
- Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. Inform the pastor when receiving communion.


