

In the spring, that time of year when rulers go off to war, King David sent Joab, commander of the army, out along with his officers and troops. They massacred the Ammonites and laid siege to Rabbah. David, however, stayed in Jerusalem.

As evening approached, David rose from his couch and strolled about on the flat roof of the palace. From the roof he saw a woman - a very beautiful woman - bathing. David made inquiries about her and learned that her name was Bathsheba, and that she was the daughter of Eliam and the wife of Uriah the Hittite, a soldier in his army. Then David sent messengers to fetch her. She came to him, and he slept with her, at a time when she had been declared ritually clean after her monthly period. Then she returned to her house. But she conceived, and sent this message to David: "I'm pregnant."

In the morning David wrote a letter to his commander Joab and sent it with Uriah, who was returning to the front lines. The letter said, "Put Uriah in the forefront where the fighting is fiercest, and then back off, leaving Uriah exposed, so that he may be struck down and die." So Joab, during the siege of the city, stationed Uriah where he knew the strongest soldiers would be attacking. When the opposing soldiers rallied and fought against Joab, some of David's troops fell, and so did Uriah the Hittite.

When Bathsheba heard that her husband was dead, she mourned for him. After the time of mourning was over, King David had her brought to the palace, and she became his wife and bore him a son. But the thing David had done displeased God.

God sent the prophet Nathan to David. Nathan went to David, and said, "Let me present you with a case for your judgment: There were two people in a certain town, one was rich and the other was poor. The rich person had very large herds of cattle and sheep, but the poor person had only one recently-purchased little ewe lamb. The poor person raised it, and it grew up with the family, adults and children alike. They shared their food with it; it drank from its own cup, and even slept inside with the family. It was like another child to the family.

Now a traveler came to the rich person, who went about giving hospitality to the traveler. But rather than taking one of his own livestock to prepare a meal for the traveler, the rich person took the little ewe lamb from the poor family and served it to the guest."

When David heard the story, he became livid, and burst out, "As the LORD lives, the rich man who did this must die! The rich man must pay for the lamb four times over! To do such a thing is evil!"

Then Nathan said to David, "You are that corrupt man! This is what the God of Israel says, 'I anointed you ruler over Israel, and I rescued you from the hand of Saul. I gave you your palace, along with your many wives in your arms. I gave you the tribes of Israel and of Judah. And if all of this had been too little, I would have added other favors as well. Why did you despise the word of God by doing what you did, which is evil in God's eyes? You struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and took his wife as your own. You murdered Uriah with the sword of the Ammonites. Now, therefore, the sword will never be far from your house; for you showed contempt of me and took Bathsheba to be your own."



Receiving Communion in your pew


You may receive communion in your pew with the elements contained in the communion pod. The pastor will say the words of distribution after the Invitation to Communion:
