

Recall that Abraham "believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness." Realize, then, that those who believe are the children of Abraham. Because scripture saw in advance that God would justify the Gentiles through faith, it foretold this Good News to Abraham: "All nations will be blessed in you." So then all who believe are blessed along with Abraham, who believed first. Before faith came, we were under the constraint of the Law, locked in until the faith that was coming would be revealed. In other words, the Law was our monitor until Christ came to bring about our justification through faith. But now that faith is here, we are no longer in the monitor's charge. Each one of you is a child of God because of your faith in Christ Jesus. All of you who have been baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. In Christ there is no Jew or Greek, slave or citizen, male or female. All are one in Christ Jesus. Furthermore, if you belong to Christ, you are the off-spring of Abraham, which means you inherit all that was promised.


We believe Jesus Christ is the host of this table, his true presence is in this meal, and you are welcome to receive the bread and wine of resurrection.


