## How to Resist Jumping to Conclusions (And relieve yourself from a lot of unnecessary suffering)

Last November, on our way to my parent's home, we slowed down to make a turn, and saw this saying on a church sign:

Instead of seeing your cup half empty or half full, why not be thankful you have a cup?

It made me laugh aloud. I'd been spending a lot of time jumping to conclusions, trying to figure out if things were "half empty or half full." But I hadn't spent a lot of time being thankful for the cup!

Since then, I've been chewing on my own reactions to what goes on around me. It's easy to jump to conclusions about what we're experiencing....assuming things about interactions with other people, or "foretelling the future" about events that are yet to unfold.

Jumping to conclusions is a human problem, one which Jesus addressed A LOT. He said: Why do you concern yourself about tomorrow's troubles? Today's troubles are enough for today. Jesus said: Before you point out the speck in someone else's eye, don't forget to take the log out of your own.

Jumping to conclusions raises anxiety, creates conflict where there might be none, and closes our minds to what God might be doing. If you don't believe me, spend an hour watching the news, and you'll soon find your reactions jumping into high gear.

There is another way. Here's what I've been practicing lately, something I go back to time and again when things feel upended:

- Sit quietly, bringing to mind a current instance that seems attached to strong emotions (i.e. something you just cannot seem to let go of....)
- What are you assuming about this situation, or person? Jot it down, or make a mental list. No need
  to be a hero here. Just be honest.
- Now ask— is that true? What else could be true? Could your loved one simply be tired, and not "always messing things up"? Could your boss be having a string of bad days, or maybe something going on at home? What about this current hardship feels out of control, and how might help be around you?
- Here's one of my favorite touchstones from the **Center for Courage and Renewal**: When the going gets rough, turn to wonder. Turn from reaction and judgment to wonder and compassionate inquiry. Ask yourself, "I wonder why they feel/think this way?" or "I wonder what my reaction teaches me about myself?" Set aside judgment to listen to others—and to yourself—more deeply.
- Ask God for help. In other words— Relieve yourself by pulling that log out of your own eye. Relieve yourself by letting tomorrow's troubles stay where they need to stay. What is in your control, and what is in God's control? What do you need?

The goal of the practice is not to give yourself credit for when you get it right, or judge yourself when you get it wrong...

The goal of the practice is to stop and see: you've got a cup in your hands.

## **Black History Month A Resilience of Spirit**

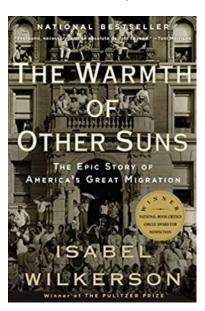
#### Connect

### <u>Update of December Financial Secretary and Treasurer/Finance Reports</u>

The following motions were approved:

**Motion**: Disperse \$900 to VBS line item, funded by Memorial Fund Monies (Dee Gossen Memorials). [Designated usage of the memorials]

Motion: Disperse \$2000 to Friends of Mwangaza, funded by Special Gifting (\$1700) and African Mission/Mwangaza (\$300). [These are the first funds for this year and they will help to continue the teach the teacher program]

**Motion**: Disperse \$400 from Seminarian Support Fund to Sue Hoff, our member who currently attends Wartburg Seminary.

**Motion**: Designate the Finance Committee to review/approve December 2021 Financial and Year End Financial Reports. [This will enable the Finance Committee to review/approve the Annual report.]

#### <u>Budget 2022</u>

The 2022 General Fund budget was discussed. Year end giving will determine the final 2022 budget proposal.

that the Food Pantry has maintained flexibility in
receiving additional food sources and turning them
around to distribute.

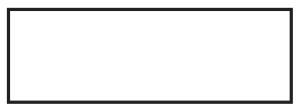
